

TexCal Cup vs California VGA Oct in SoCal

It's confirmed! We have signed a 3 year contract with VNmese golfers from California for our TC Cup. To keep up with our high level of play, they have informed us they will recruit from the entire West Coast: CA, OR, UT, WA, NV, AZ. Locations will be: 2024 in SoCal, 2025 in Houston, 2026 neutral site.

Preliminary details:

- up to 5 Non-Viets can make the team
- 4 seniors over 50 y.o. must be part of the team
- 28 players/team to play each session, + 4 alternates = 32 total
- top 16 TC Cup rankings qualify, Captains will pick 16 more = 32
- no team member is guaranteed to play, Captains' decide lineup
- plan to travel Wed-Sun tournament week
- fly into Socal Wed morning
- on the course practice rounds, Wed PM and Thu AM
- no playing on Fri allowed, practice OK
- Sat 2-man Best Ball, Sun Singles
- cost is approx. \$2000/pp, will likely be lower with Sponsor help
- includes: 4 rounds of golf, 5 days/4 nights, airfare, banquet Sat night, lunch on golf days
- memories to last a lifetime... priceless

West Coast vs HVGA will be a Battle Royale! We will need to take our game up a notch to have a chance to bring home the Cup. So set your 2024 schedule accordingly to play in enough tournaments to qualify and practice, practice, practice! This will be our toughest matchup yet!

Sponsor highlight

Richard Ta works for a private equity company in the Oil & Gas industry. As a side hustle, he runs the financial side of Mock Up Group, a custom apparel business specializing is casual menswear, hats, tees, hoodies, etc.



HVGA: How did you get started in golf?

Mock Up Group: Tiger Woods! We are about the same age, so when he won the Masters by 12 in 1997, I was a sophomore in college and was inspired to go to the range. That 1st session, I flushed a few shots, and wham! I was hooked! As broke college students we would play anywhere that was cheap, like the 9-holer at San Jacinto GC.

HVGA: How did you come to HVGA?

Mock Up Group: My wife is cousins with Quyen, wife of Kiet Luong, who was president of HVGA at the time. Kiet and I are

good friends, he's a good golfer and he recruited me to HVGA. And now, my brother Mike Ta is HVGA president so I gotta support!

HVGA: Tell us a bit about Mock Up Group.

Mock Up Group: Since it's a family business, the name is the initials of my 2 daughters and my brother-in-law's 2 daughters. Thank goodness we didn't name it after him, Hung 'Boi' Dong, which would be a completely different image! LOL. He's been in the apparel business for a long time and wanted to build his own company. He asked me to join last year to take care of the financials and operations while he does design, sales, and production. The main warehouse in Santa Ana, CA and our factories are in China. We specialize in what the industry calls 'Cut to Sew' which is total design customization from scratch, not just a replication of existing designs that are rebranded.

HVGA: Very VNmese thing to do, keep everything in the family, from the name to the manpower. Who are your customers and is the MOQ (minimum order quantity)?

Mock Up Group: We have customers who are big chains like Macy's, to boutiques, to influencers doing private label. Our typical order is 200-300 pieces per design per color. 8000-10,000 would be one of our bigger orders, but we can go as low as 1000 pieces. Since we are a new entity, business is mostly word of mouth, but we look to begin marketing and our sponsorship of HVGA is one of the ways.

HVGA: What does the future look like for you?

Mock Up Group: If things continue to go well, I hope to leave my 9-5 day job and work on Mock Up Group full time, control my own schedule and play more golf with you sharks!

The sudden passing of my friend Thomas Nguyen left me in a daze for most of March. Sometimes out of nowhere, the emotions overwhelm me.

So it was heartening to see us compete with MAVGA, the group he introduced to us; to see his son Noah get out on the golf course, to battle and play the sport

his dad so dearly loved; to see the outpouring of love that collected \$15,000+ for his kids; to see all of your faces at his wake and funeral services; to see his legacy continue: make friends, play golf, and take care of family.

After the funeral, I sat down to dinner with anh Bach, president of VGAoA, and Olivia Tran, the Toronto businesswoman and sponsor. We made plans for the future, how to interconnect all the VGAs in America, how to grow the game, how to uplift and inspire our VNmese community, on and off the golf course. It was cathartic to look ahead and plan for bigger better things... just like Thomas would've wanted. Some may say immortality can only be found in one's faith. I say life beyond death lingers in the hearts and minds of those we leave behind. We miss you, Thomas. And the best way to honor and remember you is to continue your legacy: friends, golf, family.

THOMAS NGUYÊN

March 16, 1965-March 10, 2024

Father. Golfer. Leader. That's how I will remember Thomas, my dear friend... "Nhó Thomas."

He met his wife Ashley in college and was devoted to her for 30 years. He was so proud of their 3 kids, always bragging about Audrey in Med School, Nicolas joining her next semester, and Noah always by his side, joining him for dinner with his adult friends or traveling with him on his many golf trips.

Thomas was a golf fanatic so, of course, all 3 kids played. For him, the perfect day would be golf, eating and laughing with friends, and if his kids were with him, he couldn't be happier. It's poetic justice that his last days were spent golfing. He lived life to the fullest.

There was Social Thomas - at dinner, laughing and joking, then there was Competitor Thomas - on the golf course. Betting was a given, but he wanted to win, he wanted to beat you. As with all of us, our golf game comes and goes, but if he had a birdie putt, he would flip a switch, turn on the concentration of a chess grandmaster, sneak up behind the ball, and willed himself into the Zone. Make or miss, you knew he would give that birdie-try everything he had, every time. That's a lesson I will take with me, when an opportunity presents itself, give it your all, everything, every time.

He was a great reader of the greens, as he was a great reader of people. Put him in a room full of people and by the end of the night, he could tell you what everyone did for a living, their



strengths and weaknesses. He was so persuasive that some of these new acquaintances would be sponsors for his next golf event or organization. And he loved connecting people from all over the world. I've met so many new friends because of Thomas, and I've donated my fair share to his causes. We can all take a page out his book: instead of complaining, get involved and change things for the better. It's not an understatement to say he was one of the most influential voices in amateur Vietnamese golf today. That will be one of his legacies. VGA of America reached unprecedented heights under his watch. HVGA owes a lot of our evolution to Thomas. And whether you agree with him or not, there's no denying he always fought for what he believed in. That's another lesson I'll take with me.

In Vietnamese the word for missing someone and remembering him is the same: $nh\acute{o}$. The void he left in this world is irreplaceable... " $nh\acute{o}$ Thomas luôn luôn (forever)."
